Mayor's Message of June 5 2020

This is West Caldwell Mayor Joe Tempesta with a public service announcement.

Please be advised the West Caldwell Health Department has informed us there have been 116 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the West Caldwell general population and we have had 6 citizens pass away from the virus. Of the 116 cases 5 are open and current cases. Of the 5, 2 are hospitalized and 3 are home quarantined. Thankfully we have had 105 cases closed whereby these citizens are recovered and are no longer quarantined. We ask that you pray for those who have the virus and to pray for those families that have lost their loved ones.

In our two skilled nursing facilities combined we currently have an additional 42 cases and tragically we report 42 deaths. In Crane's Mill we have 18 Covid-19 cases in the memory care an assisted living units, and 6 reported deaths. In the Skilled Nursing and sub-acute section of Crane's Mill, we have 20 current cases of Covid-19 and 11 reported deaths. In the Hackensack Meridian Health WC Care Center, we report 4 current cases of Covid-19. Tragically we report 25 deaths at the facility. Again, we ask that you pray for those who have the virus and to pray for those families that have lost their loved ones.

I also ask that you continue to join me in thanking all of our first responders and a special thanks to all of our teachers in our community. We thank them for all of their hard work.

Governor Murphy announced that additional businesses are being allowed to open June 15 including retail businesses, day care facilities, and outdoor dining for restaurants, all with guidelines and restrictions. In July summer camps and hopefully Township Pools will be able to open however no guidelines or restrictions have been released. We also expect our Library to open soon.

We ask that you continue patronize our local businesses by using technology to make your purchases on line as well patronize our restaurants by using their takeout and delivery services.
